



Hershey Country Club Fact Sheet

COURSES:

West Course

Designed by Maurice McCarthy in 1930, this course is a classic example of a traditional American-style layout. The signature hole is the par-3 fifth. This 176-yard gem features spectacular scenery with High Point Mansion, Milton S. Hershey's former home, as backdrop. The 6,860-yard, par-73 course has a rating of 72.6 and slope rating of 130.

East Course

Built in 1970, this course features elevated greens, man-made lakes, and more than 100 bunkers. Designer George Fazio captured the natural beauty of central Pennsylvania's countryside with views that golfers can appreciate on every hole. The 7,061-yard course boasts numerous natural hazards, rolling fairways and difficult greens. With a water-lined fairway on both sides, its par-4 15th hole is one of the most difficult. This par-71 course has a rating of 74.5 with a slope rating of 136.

Spring Creek Golf Course

Mr. Hershey built **Spring Creek Golf Course** in 1930, a nine-hole layout playing to 2,318 yards, par 33. Originally named The Juvenile Golf Club, it was the first course in the United States open to players under age 18. In 1969, it was renamed **Spring Creek Golf Course** for its namesake Spring Creek, a water hazard that repeatedly confronts golfers. A complete course renovation in 2006 resulted in three new holes and six that were modified. While remaining beginner-friendly, the remodeled **Spring Creek** plays at 2,220 yards, with a second set of tees (playing at 2,416 yards) creating an 18-hole experience as well.

Hershey Country Club courses are private, but open to guests of Hershey Resorts. **Spring Creek** is open to the public.

GREEN FEES:	Green fees are \$115, including cart.
PRIMARY GRASSES:	Tees: Bentgrass Fairways: Ryegrass Greens: Bentgrass Rough: Bluegrass and fescue
HISTORICAL NOTES:	Legendary golf heroes have graced Hershey's fairways, including Byron Nelson, Jack Nicklaus, Arnold Palmer, Sam Snead, and former club pros and World Golf Hall of Fame members Ben Hogan and Henry Picard.
EVENTS:	The East Course was home to the Nationwide Tour Reese's Cup Classic from 1997 to 2004. The West Course hosted the 1940 PGA Championship with the legendary Byron Nelson taking home the crown. The West Course was the site of the LPGA Tour's Lady Keystone Open for almost 20 years.
RECOGNITION:	Hershey Country Club has been ranked among the Top 50 Resorts in the United States by <i>Golf Digest</i> since 1999. Hershey Resorts was named a <i>GOLF Magazine</i> Silver Medalist in 2000, 2002, 2004 and 2006. Hershey Resorts was included in <i>Travel + Leisure Golf's</i> "World's Best Resorts" 2004 issue. Hershey Resorts was recognized by The International Network of Golf (ING) for excellence in the consumer print advertising category in 2004.
PACKAGES & AMENITIES:	Packages combining rooms, food and beverage, golf, and spa services are available throughout the year. Hershey Country Club offers a pool and tennis complex for its members, golf lessons by on-staff golf professionals, a driving range, meeting rooms/function space, and the Hershey Country Club Pro Shop. In 2006 the Country Club underwent an \$18 million renovation that improved every aspect of the member and resort guest experience.
